Therme Art Announces New Leadership Team

Therme Art, the arts and culture arm of global wellbeing organisation Therme Group, has appointed a new leadership team for its curatorial programme and management.

The organisation's arts and culture initiatives will be led by artist Shelby Seu, architect and curator Marta Cavallé and art consultant Yi Weihua, based in Berlin who have previously led Therme Art projects worldwide. The team will continue to work on a diverse programme of engagements, that has included collaborations with the Serpentine Pavilion, partnering with the British Council at Venice Biennale, and hosting a series of 'Wellbeing Culture Forum' events.

John White has been appointed to the role of Managing Director of Therme Art, replacing Mikolaj Sekutowicz who left Therme Art earlier in the year to pursue an independent business interest and is no longer involved with Therme Group. White will be supported by artist and entrepreneur Roksana Ciurysek-Gedir, who has taken on an advisory role with Therme Art. Both White and Ciurysek-Gedir also serve as Directors of immersive art company Superblue, in which Therme Group is the largest investor.

Therme Group has a global pipeline of large-scale wellbeing resort developments and Therme Art works to integrate artistic experiences into these projects and the communities in which they are located. This has included artist workshops at schools in Bucharest, Sibiu and Manchester, the upcoming location of Therme Manchester, which is set to be the UK's first city-based wellbeing resort.

John White, commented, "The new leadership team at Therme Art is continuing its work in driving our arts and culture programme forward, with a renewed focus on bringing spectacular experiences at the intersection of art, culture, wellbeing and science to our wellbeing resorts and the communities we serve."
